Such patients entertain not infrequently a fear of the invasion of some disease or of impending death; for these latter conditions the terms nosophobia, pathophobia, and thanatophobia have been proposed, and have by some writers been used as equivalent with hypochondriasis. It is one of the objects of the present paper to draw a distinction between these conditions, and to show that hypochondriasis is a well-marked neurosis by itself, plainly distinguishable from other neuroses by its definite symptoms, course, and termination, differing, on the one hand, from nosophobia, and, on the other hand, from hypochondriacal insanity, with which it has been confounded by some writers on psychological medicine. Hypochondriacal Insanity.-It is a great mistake to assume that most hypochondriacs are insane; on the contrary, they are frequently in good mental health for the ordinary purposes of life.
